As we enter the month of March and the season of Lent, we are on the verge of something. Several somethings, in fact. I suppose it is true that unless we remain huddled together in the middle facing inward, we are always on the verge. Often, we rely on the boldest and most adventurous among us to stand at the edge and look beyond, facing what is to come and by virtue of our continued standing there, give assurance that whatever it is, is perhaps not so bad after all, even in the midst of the unknown.

We are getting a new pastor! What will that be like?  
We are heading toward a split in our denomination. Will that even affect us at all?  
This is an election year. What will the outcome mean for me, my family, my life?

I know it feels safer to stay huddled together facing inward. And trust me, I like safety as much as the next person. However, throughout my ministry journey, I have come to know and trust that safety and security are found in God and God alone.

Meister Eckhart, a 13<sup>th</sup> century German theologian, philosopher, and mystic wrote a two-part reflection titled *All That Baggage*:

*Where the creaturely ends in me is where*

*God has the room to begin, on the far*

*side of my desires and demands, beyond*

*my expectations and worries and needs.*

*When I let go of all that, like letting a heavy sack*

*drop from my drooping shoulders, God has room*

*to be God within me, and I wonder what*

*I thought I needed with all that baggage*

*in the first place.*

On the far side of our creaturely expectations, worries, and needs we find space for God to begin. When we keep ourselves insulated within them, huddling and facing inward with other creatures who are clinging to the same baggage, expectations, worries, and needs, we miss out on the freedom of letting go and letting God!

I know it is hard to step into a new thing, a new day, a new experience, a new situation. But I know – because I KNOW – that whatever we face together, or whatever you face individually, God is already there waiting to reveal his presence, provision, power, and yes even his protection in astonishing ways. If I never turn outward and face the change, I will never experience the fullness of God in those ways.

"I raise my eyes toward the mountains. Where will my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth (and the mountains). God won't let your foot slip. Your protector won't fall asleep on the job. No! your protector never sleeps or rests. The Lord is your protector; the lord is the shade right beside you. The sun won't strike you during the day, nor the moon at night. The Lord will protect you from all evil; God will protect your very life. The Lord will protect you on your journeys – whether going or coming – from now until forever from now."

*Psalm 121 CEB*



Convinced that all people have God-given worth and dignity—without regard to race, religion or gender—together we are assisting those impacted by crisis or chronic need.

Bishop David Alan Bard of the Michigan Area has called for a special session of the Michigan Annual Conference to be held Saturday, March 7, 2020 from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. at **Goodrich Chapel on the campus of Albion College in Albion, Michigan**. The sole purpose of this session of the Michigan Annual Conference will be to consider whether the Michigan Conference will send the legislation based on the Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace Through Separation to General Conference 2020 so it might be considered by the delegates to the General Conference.

On January 3, 2020, a diverse, **16-member group of United Methodist bishops and other leaders offered a proposal** that would preserve The United Methodist Church while allowing traditionalist-minded congregations to form a new denomination. The separating group would receive \$25 million in United Methodist funds and would keep its local church properties. The proposal has since been developed into legislation that on March 7th The Michigan Conference will consider sending to the 2020 General Conference.

The members of this session of the Michigan Annual Conference include all clergy members of the conference in addition to the lay members or alternates who were last seated at the 2019 Annual Conference. If members elected by local churches or chosen by districts through the Board of Laity are unable or unavailable to attend, churches and districts may elect other persons to serve (*The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church* ¶602.5). If you are unable to attend, please inform your local church and/or district office.




## Job Posting
